



BRONISLAW GEREMEK is the former Foreign Minister of Poland and a scholar of medieval European history, especially of France and Poland. He was born in 1932 in Warsaw, Poland and educated at the University of Warsaw and Sorbonne. He taught at the Polish Academy of Sciences, Sorbonne, Collège de France and other European and American universities. Author of many publications translated into many languages.

Professor Geremek is a member and co-founder of the Union of Freedom, founding member of Solidarity's Independent Self-Governing Trade Union and former advisor to its leader Lech Wałęsa, 1989 – 2001 member of the Sejm (lower chamber of the Polish Parliament) and chairman of the Sejm Foreign Affairs Committee.

Awarded and decorated with many prizes and orders like: Légion d'Honneur, Grosses Verdienstkreuz mit Stern des Verdienstordens der Bundesrepublik Deutschland, l'Ordre National du Mérite, Karls Preis, Premi speciali per la Cultura, Orden Pour le mérite für Wissenschaften und Künste, Grand Prix de la Francophonie, Order Orła Białego.

Member of many prestigious organisations and associations: Academia Europea, Académie Universelle des Cultures, Royal Historical Society, PEN Club, Council on Foreign Relations Independent Task Force on Threats to Democracy, International Crisis Group, Commission on Human Security, International UNESCO Scientific Committee, Reflection group about the spiritual dimension of Europe to European Commission.
